MSSA 2025 Book Study Opportunities

This year MSSA will offer two types of book study opportunities.

- 1. Group book study will read, "What Great Teachers Do Differently" (based on voting from the sign up link and the Standards workshops.) Weekly meetings, for seven weeks, on a book of the group's choice. Hour long discussions. Sixteen professional development hours. Hopefully we will have a Fall and Winter book study this year. I will contact everyone who showed an interest but, if you did not sign up before you can send me a quick email, or just show up at the first Zoom meeting on September 25, 2025, from 5:30-6:30 PM. A brief overview of the book is attached. Please purchase your book (3rd edition) and be ready to start our book study on September 25th. The book study will be Thursday's from September 25 to November 13, 2025.
- Independent reading/work book study. The sign up deadline is September 15, 2025. This offering is for the book, "180 Days of Self-Care For Busy Educators". You must sign up to get the credit. If you cannot get the link to work, email me with your interest.
 - You will work independently throughout the year, reading the book and completing the weekly reading and activities. There will be a check in four times throughout the year, at the end of each section of the book, and a final summary paper. The check in will just be a short 2-3 questions about the experience so far and if you are still wanting to continue the independent study. Since this is a year long study, you will receive 12 professional development hours, in June 2026, upon successful completion of the activities and summary. County Schools Feature Lewis and Clark County Schools- Part II

Auchard Creek School is located on Milford Colony, as one might describe, in the middle of nowhere, between Wolf Creek and Augusta. With the vast expanse across the highway from the colony, the view of the Rockies from this site is truly breathtaking, no matter the time of year.

Auchard Creek School sits enmeshed in the plain beige metal homes around it. The school building blends in with the nearby homes of the students. The thirteen K -8th students walk or scooter to school, to lunch, and after school to German class. These students have long, busy days, so recess time in their outdoor paradise is a time they enjoy to the fullest. Students of all ages enjoy recess: playing dodgeball, baseball, swinging, or playing tag. A recent outdoor basketball court has provided hours of evening entertainment this summer for the students and colony members.

Educator, Josh Wood, has been commuting 2 hours each day from Great Falls to his teaching position at the Milford Colony, for 25 years. Josh started this position shortly after college and has stayed committed to this job, his students, and the colony members.

Students enter school shortly after they reach their 6th birthday, so young students trickle in throughout the school year. Most students know only a few English words when they start school, as communication at home and around the colony is in German. Mr. Wood begins teaching English to his young students, along with other basic subjects when the students start school. He teaches all subjects, except music and library skills. The colony hires a specialist for these two areas. Mr. Wood obtained his counseling degree a few years back, so he is the supervising teacher, ESL teacher, and the school counselor!

Six kindergartens, all girls, will join the older students this fall, to increase the enrollment of Auchard Creek School enrollment from 13 to 19 for the 2025-26.
